



#### Founded in 1977

- 39 classes
- 836 students
- 122 students (8%) have Special Educational Needs
  - 20 have a certified disability
  - 45have specific learning disorders
  - 57 have linguistic, cultural, relational or socioeconomic disadvantages.
- 111 students (13%) are foreign (non-Italian citizenship)
- 64 teachers on permanent contracts
- 25 teachers on temporary contracts
- 11 teachers for students with special learning needs
- 26 members of administrative, technical and auxiliary staff on long term contracts
- The Headmistress and the Head of the Administrative Department are also on permanent assignments






# Language Projects

√Over 30 years' good practice in the running of summer work placements for students (3week duration) at the end of the 4<sup>th</sup> grades in companies, banks, public /private agencies and hotels.

# Improvement areas: 1. Methodology





- teaching methods focused more on content than on crossdisciplinary competences do not guarantee students' success
- tendency to measure the content of the subjects taught rather than skills

- make learning more engaging by strengthening the independent use of knowledge in real situations
- build their knowledge actively in learning contexts based on experience.
- student-centered learning processes for the development of key and specific skills in both formal and informal contexts

# Improvement areas: 2. Internationalisation





- students have few opportunities to open up to an international context, except through cultural enrichment initiatives envisaged by the School Education Plan.
- the school often relies on selfreference

- increase inclusion projects
- build organic and integrated curricula with the interaction of different actors, environments and resources within and outside the school

- •Develop projects to strengthen responsible citizenship skills, with particular attention to respect for legality, the prevention of discrimination, solidarity, intercultural education and peace.
